#### Announcement: Expansion of In-Class Instruction Starting June 1

Today, Minister Fleming announced an <u>increase to in-class instruction</u> under Stage 3 of <u>BC's K-12 Education Restart Plan</u>. This announcement included new <u>Provincial COVID-19 Health and Safety Guidelines for K-12 Setting</u> that adhere to the standards set by <u>WorkSafeBC</u> and the <u>BC Centre for Disease Control</u>.

The Ministry recognizes the right of First Nations to determine the approach to instruction in First Nations schools and will continue to work closely with the First Nations Schools Association and the First Nations Education Steering Committee (FNESC) to share information and collaborate on areas of mutual interest. The Ministry will also continue to work with FNESC to ensure that the increase to in-class instruction in the BC K-12 system is implemented in a manner consistent with the Province's broader obligations to Indigenous students and their families.

## Action Required: Stage 3 Return-to-School Instruction Plan for School Districts

Following today's announcement for the move to Stage 3, school districts are asked to submit a return-to-instruction plan to the Ministry at <u>educ.covid@gov.bc.ca</u> by Monday, May 25. Please use this <u>template</u> to complete your school district's plan. The Independent Schools Branch is working with FISA to develop their own template and a separate process. Further information will follow. First Nations independent school authorities are exempt from this process and request.
