## Truth and Reconciliation

In 2007, as an outcome of the Indian Residential Schools Settlement Agreement, the Canadian Government initiated a Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC). The Mandate of the TRC was to let the country know the stories and impact of residential schools. In 2015 the final report was delivered to the Prime Minister. The purpose of the TRC was to unearth the truth from those who were personally affected by their experiences in residential schools.

We have all heard many times the quote by Honourable Justice Murray Sinclair, Chair of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, who stated that "education got us into this mess and education will get us out of it."
